to everyone who helped with the KID'S CARNIVAL, Sat., July 20.




It was a big success because of all of you.



Mission Trip 2013 Report – Middletown, Ohio July 6-14, 2013

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Eleven youth and five adults from Spirit of Life traveled to Middletown, Ohio for Group Work Camp. We rented a 15-passenger van, plus Duane Brause and Eric Scott drove their cars. The group stayed in New Castle, Indiana Saturday evening at the home of Pastor Rob's friends, Kent and Judy, and their daughter. On the trip back, the group stayed at First Presbyterian Church in Marion, Iowa, the church where Pastor Rob interned. We were treated to pizza dinners and breakfasts and great hospitality at both stops.



There were 187 campers at this Work Camp divided into 31 work sites within the city of Middletown, Ohio. We stayed at the Rosa Parks Elementary School, sleeping on the floor in sleeping bags and eating cafeteria food. Eric Scott's position was "Red Shirt Site Coach" so he was in charge of six sites. The rest of the youth and adults were split up into crews of 5-6 (1-2 adults and 4-5 youth). The projects that we completed included: painting a three story house using scaffolding, painting a two story house, painting parts of the house such as trim, porches, garages, etc., tearing down a garage, building wheel chair ramps, roofing a house, and building decks. It was hard but meaningful work.

The week was not all work, for we did enjoy many fun activities. Every morning and evening we attended devotional programs with praise singing. Wednesday evening there was a variety show. The Fresh Trash band performed. Ashlie Tisland also performed, singing and accompanying herself on the guitar. On Wednesday afternoon we had free time. We went

with the Tennessee youth group to "The Beach," a local waterpark, and then dinner. Several of the youth competed in the Dodge Ball Tourney. All of the youth and adults enjoyed writing and getting "Care Cards," notes of affirmation from their youth group, crew, and other friends made during the week.

Going on a mission trip is a wonderful experience of spiritual growth, learning new skills, making new friends and reconnecting with old friends. Helping those less fortunate, and appreciating our own family, youth group, church, and homes are also mission trip benefits. I would encourage anyone to participate. You will be so proud of our youth, they truly shine.

Session News

Newsletter - Spirit of Life Presbyterian Church Session Minutes - June 20, 2013

A quorum was present (9 of 9 Session members and 5 of 6 Deacons) for the joint meeting of Session and Deacons on June 20, 2013. Pastor Smith offered an opening prayer. Psalm 139: 23 and 24 and Proverbs 14: were read. Pastor Smith led a discussion on the value of mistakes and how can we as leaders take risks and look forward while building a culture of agility. Discussion included: fear of failure, fear of getting stuck in the same thing (committee) forever, fear of criticism from others.

Elder and Deacon pins were presented. Session and Deacon Books were handed out. A discussion was held on the priorities, dreams and goals determined at the Session Retreat on January 26, 2013.

Current priorities were listed as: growth, Deacon team development, music program, and mission and local outreach.

Duane Brause stated that the Deacons are redefining their position to be: caring and nurturing of the congregation, providing funeral refreshment arrangements, providing rides to church, and providing in-home communion for shut-ins. In discussing mission and outreach, it was suggested that we focus more on mission and not just community service, such as promoting the Crop Walk.

Dreams were listed as: forming a Children's Choir, adding more Sunday school and adult classes, hosting a coffee house, enhancing the labyrinth, hiring a paid Christian Ed. director, fully utilizing the property and outdoor space, enhancing the building (liked stained glass windows), adding an active summer bible school and after school program.

Goals were listed. Worship and Music goal is to involve more people in delivering dynamic worship services. The goal for HUB is to freshen up the interior of the building including: acoustics, painting, bathrooms, changing janitorial service, improving entry way and kitchen. We also want to better utilize the garden, Labyrinth and outdoor space. We want to consider installation of a commercial dishwasher and different outdoor signage. The goal for relationships is to develop congregational mentoring program, deal with cookie service conflict and acknowledge relationship conflicts. Goals for Community Service include engaging with Montessori school, Boy scouts and Cub scouts, partnering with other groups such as churches working on the Crop walk and identifying additional activities like softball leagues, or youth group meetings with other churches. The goal for youth is to develop an afterschool program. The goal for leadership is to have more times to interact outside of Session meetings and to identify potential future leaders by starting volunteer mentoring.

Correspondence was a thank you letter, written to John Barrington for his Eagle Scout project.

Team Reports included a special report by visioning Ad-Hoc committee on strategic planning for Wednesday after school program and Outreach. A banner for Kid's Camp will be made and attached to our permanent monument signage on Pilot Knob Rd. Worship and Music stated what the special services would be for the summer and they were approved. Community Service discussed having an open house in August for the Crop Walk. Tech Team stated that there will be some revision of website coming in the future. HUB will be reorganizing with Denise Lewis and Bob Shepard leading the group. There was a discussion on having the lawn service trim the Linden trees because the branches were impeding lawn mowing. Personnel requested to have the audio of the Sunday morning service heard up in the nursery. Julie Raatz will test a baby monitor in the sanctuary to communicate audio to the nursery.

Old Business included assigning Session member to be team liaisons: Worship and Music - be Marge Lewis, Personnel - chaired by Julie Raatz and members will be Bob Shepard and Leslie Hohmann, HUB - Denise Lewis, Tech team - Leslie Hohmann, Community Service - Chris Sachs, Education/youth group - Brian Gracek, Stewardship- Rebecca Brandt, Outreach - Peggy Roeske. The Clearwater retreat will be postponed due to being the same weekend as the October Crop Walk.

New Business included setting the **Session meeting date for the third Thursday of the Month**. There was a discussion on volunteerism and mentoring. Concerns and joys of individuals were expressed and prayers offered to close the meeting. Clerk of Session, Karen Johnson

Newsletter - Spirit of Life Presbyterian Church Session Minutes - July 18, 2013

A quorum was present (5 of 9 Session members) for the Session meeting on July 18, 2013. Pastor Smith offered an opening prayer. Call to worship was based on Psalm 127. Pastor Smith led a discussion on leadership – who are they and how do we nurture them. Discussion included: recognizing that new people are coming to our church and how do we nurture and mentor them.

Pastor Rob gave his report concerning attendance, pastor visits, calendar of events, thanks to Trevor Swaim for the bike donation for the Carnival, thanks to Jeff Mortimer for preaching and thanks in advance to Steve Raatz for preaching July 28th. The financial report was given by Barb Ostlund. Year to date contributions are down \$10,000 but expenses are also down so year to date variance is up \$1900. Barb stated that in "Other funds" we have over \$800 to be used for kitchen expenses. It was moved and carried that Barb close out the "Piano" fund of the "Other funds" by charging the last \$50 left in it to the "Instrument" line of the "General fund". Minutes of the June 20 stated Session meeting were read and approved. Attendance was reviewed.

Team Reports included a special report by visioning Ad-Hoc committee on strategic planning for Wednesday after school program and Outreach. Discussion was on the Carnival coming up July 20, the Kid's Camp coming August 5 and the Wednesday afterschool program coming in September. Christian Ed had no report on Sunday school but included a report on the completed Mission Trip. Outreach report was on the Press releases for the Carnival and Kid's Camp. Worship and Music reported that there will be a special service September 8 for recognition of Sunday school teachers and volunteers and may include a Chili cook-off and Harvest of Talents. In October there will be an International Pot Luck dinner for World Wide Communion. Community Service discussed collection of school supplies in July and August and the open house in August for the Crop Walk. Stewardship had no report. Tech Team stated that Josh Ullom will report at the August Session meeting on revision of the website. HUB reported on a new Eagle Scout project to refurbish the patio, rebuild the woodshed, add a fire pit, and refinish picnic tables and benches. It was moved and carried to allow for \$375 out of the Eagle Scout fund to be used for this project. The acoustic report was discussed and it was decided to move the speakers as suggested in the report. It was moved and carried to table the acoustic project at this time and revisit it at a later date. Personnel had no report.

Old Business included discussion to postpone the Clearwater retreat until next spring. There was also discussion on the use of a baby monitor to get audio to the nursery, it will be reviewed. Pastor Rob will begin a new member class August 4 and will look into a job description for mentors so that we can have a mentor for each of the new members and the mentors will know what they should do. Pastor Rob would also like to have mentors for the Confirmation class which will start in September.

New Business included a discussion on September 12 – World Day of Prayer. Concerns and joys of individuals were expressed and prayers offered to close the meeting.



CROP Hunger Walk Planning Update:

We have a team started on line, under the title *Spirit of Life Presbyterian Church*. Anyone can register for the team, or make donations, by going to www.cropwalk.org, searching for "South of the River CROP Hunger walk" in Minnesota. **Our goal is to get 15 walkers, and raise at least \$1,500.**





Spirit of Life will host a recruiters' open house on **Wednesday**, **August 21**, **from 4-8 PM**. Denise Lewis will host this, and everyone is welcome to stop in and say "hi"! The purpose is for other church team recruiters to come and pick up materials to get a team organized for the walk, and to get their questions answered. If anyone would like to help, it would be much appreciated.

The steering committee is made up of 7 churches, some large, some small; at the last meeting overall goals for this first annual South of the River CROP Walk were established. Within the steering committee congregations, it was estimated we could have 200 walkers, and raise \$10,000. We hope to get at least 13 more churches or other community groups to participate, so our goal is 400 walkers, and \$20,000 in donations. 25% will go to 360 Communities and CAP Agency.

The walk route will be in Burnsville, so we will not be a stop on the route; we could consider partnering with the smaller churches that are hosting the first and third rest stops. This would involve planning for water and refreshments, as well as working on developing educational materials to raise awareness of hunger and poverty globally, which is also a mission of CROP Walks. We could also assist in providing entertainment at the rest stop. If anyone has an interest in helping organize this, please contact Denise.

Blueberry Brunch Cake

Recipe for:

From the kitchen of: Pat Buchholz

2 C. all purpose flour 2 tsp baking powder 1/2 tsp salt 1/2 tsp ground ginger 1/4 tsp baking soda

1 C. sugar

1/2 C. butter or margarine softened

2 eggs

3/4 C. sour cream 1 tsp vanilla

2 C. fresh or frozen blueberries

1/4 C. sugar

1 tsp ground cinnamon

Heat oven to 350°. Grease and flour bottom and sides of a 13 x 9 x 2 inch pan. Mix flour, baking powder, salt, ginger, and baking soda in a medium bowl, set aside. Mix 1 cup sugar and the butter in a large bowl. Stir in eggs, sour cream, and vanilla. Stir in flour mixture. Carefully fold in blueberries. Spoon into pan. Mix 1/4 cup sugar and the cinnamon, sprinkle over batter. Bake about 40 minutes or until golden brown. Enjoy!
